Activities will be conducted on a year-round basis regardless of weather, and are to include time trials, economy runs, obstacle races, and other driving contests.

The big problem at this time is to locate a suitable area at which the smaller events may be held. A gymkhana (obstacle course) generally consists of driving zig-zag through a series of hay bales against time, and requires a large, flat lot.
