McGuire Battles Airlines

Rep. John A. McGuire's two-year congressional fight to keep fly-by-night airline operators out of the clouds finally bore fruit this week.

The Third District Democrat's battle against the "wing and a prayer" air transport school began when he was deeply stirred

McGuire declared he was "very pleased" that the CAB found his old proposal "in the public interest."

McGuire, who also successfully piloted the "fair trades" bill through the House, expressed the hope today that the Senate Interstate and Foreign Commerce committee would give the measure the green light within the next few days so that it could be passed before adjournment.

The bill, in effect, would prevent merchants from selling products shipped in interstate commerce below a stipulated retail
